

**Circular for Admission of Foreign Nationals for Academic Session 2009-2010 in
Bangladesh University of Engineering & Technology (BUET)**

Bangladesh University of Engineering & Technology (BUET) has announced the admission circular for the foreign nationals at undergraduate level for academic session 2009-2010 under self-finance scheme. There are 26 seats for foreign students in undergraduate level. The pre-requisite qualification for admission is H.S.C. or GCE A level or its equivalent with good grades in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and English. Tuition and other fees per credit is US\$ 50 (Fifty US dollar). Maximum 10 students from a single country are allowed for admission.

The criteria & procedure of application and prescribed application form for foreign students are furnished below. Interested foreign students are requested to submit the same to this Embassy by 21 January 2010.

Admission of Foreign Nationals for Academic Session 2009-2010

Foreign nationals can submit their application till 15 February, 2010 for admission in the undergraduate courses of this university for the Session 2009-2010. Applicants who passed the Higher Secondary Certificate (H.S.C) examination or its equivalent in 2008 or GCE A level examination after November 2007 are eligible to apply, subject to fulfillment of other conditions.

1. Eligible Criteria

- (a) Foreign nationals having their “O” Level and “A” Level or Equivalent education in foreign countries shall be considered as ‘foreign’ Students.
- (b) Candidates must have passed higher secondary examination or its equivalent examination from a foreign education board with minimum “B” grades in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and English.
- (c) Candidates passing the GCE “O” Level and GCE “A” Level and seeking admission must earn an average of B grade in at least five subjects (including Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and English) and at least two A grades in the three subjects of Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and B grade in the other subject in GCE “A” Level examination.

2. Number of Seates

The total number of seats for foreign students in undergraduate level in a single academic session is 26 (twenty six). However, a maximum of 10 (ten) students from a single country and maximum of 5 (five) students in a single department shall be allowed.

3. Procedure for Submission of Application

Application for must be submitted through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of their country to Government of Bangladesh. The relevant documents of educational qualifications and 3 (three) recently taken color photographs of the candidate should be included with the application form. After receiving the applications, the Admission committee will select the eligible candidates for Admission in order of merit.

4. Cost Study

The tuition and other fees for undergraduate studies for students from SAARC countries will be charged as per regulations of Government of the People’s Republic of Bangladesh. The students from non-SAARC countries will be charged US\$ 50 (Fifty) only per credit.

Applications are to be submitted in triplicates to the Ministry of Education (those applying for medicine should do it to the Ministry of Health), Govt. of People's Republic of Bangladesh through the Bangladesh diplomatic representative in the country of the candidate's domicile or the diplomatic representative of the candidate's country in Bangladesh. If the proposed admission is in pursuance of an agreement between the Govt. of Bangladesh & the Govt. of applicant's country of domicile, the application has to be routed through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of that country of domicile.
 4. All certificates and mark sheets essentially be attested by the Foreign Ministry of the respective countries of the candidates without which no application will be entertained.
 5. Only for MBBS and BDS courses the applicant must enclose a non-refundable demand draft of US \$ 50 or Taka 3,000/-
